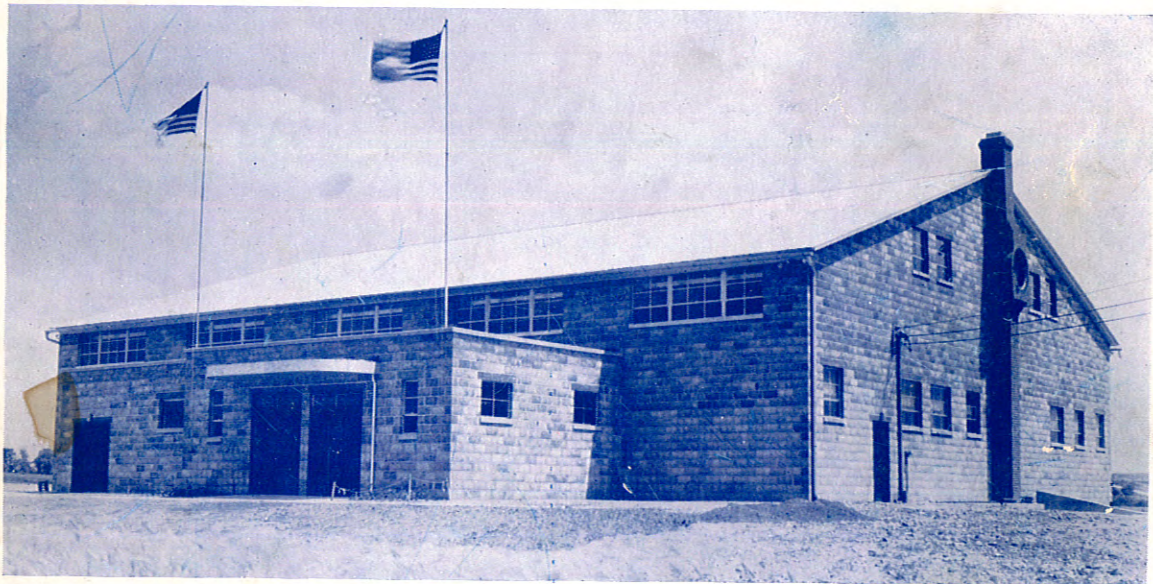

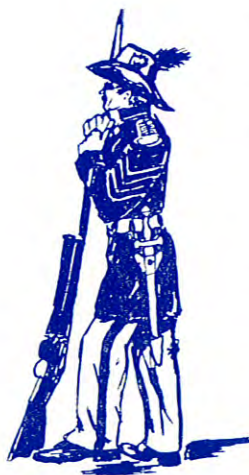

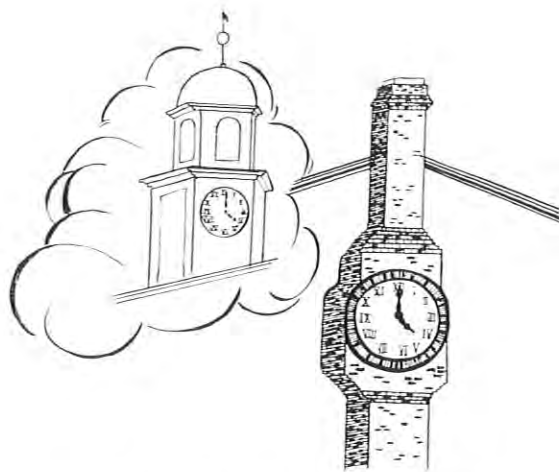

- 1744—First settlement near Orwigsburg by Wilhelm Deibert.
- 1745—John Hartman and wife settled near the Deiberts.
- 1747—George Gottfried Orwig and wife, Gloria, located at Sculp's Hill.
- 1755—John Hartman and oldest son, George, massacred by Indians; Barbara and Regina taken prisoners; Barbara scalped en route to camp. Mrs. Hartman and Regina were reunited at the close of the Indian Wars.
- 1755—Organization of the first church north of the Blue Mts., Zion's Evangelical Lutheran and Reformed Church, familiarly called the "Red" Church, just outside the borough limits.
- 1773—Settlement in Orwigsburg by Peter Orwig.
- 1796—Site of present town plotted by Peter Orwig and named "Orwigsburg" in honor of his father.
- 1811—Formation of the County of Schuylkill - Orwigsburg chosen as county seat.
First school was built of log and stones at Tammany and Washington Streets. Site of the Old Reformed Church.
- 1813—Orwigsburg incorporated as a borough March 12, and is the oldest borough in the county.
- 1813—Establishment of the Orwigsburg Academy. Building was demolished in 1870.
- 1813—Schuylkill Lodge No. 138, Free and Accepted Masons organized June 7.
- 1814—Erection of first jail. Converted into a school house in 1864.
- 1815—Erection of the first Schuylkill County Court House at Orwigsburg. Sessions held here until 1851, when the county seat was moved to Pottsville.
- 1815—Organization of Salem Evangelical Congregation, January 23.
- 1819—First Bible Society of Schuylkill County organized November 10.
- 1826—Erection of a new stone school building on the present site of the Evangelical Cemetery.
- 1831—Organization of "The German Reformed and Lutheran Congregations of St. John's Church in Orwigsburg". The Lutheran congregation later erected its own building and was incorporated under the title of "The Evangelical Lutheran Congregation of St. Paul's Church of Orwigsburg."
- 1844—"The Evangelical Lutheran Congregation of St. Paul's Church of Orwigsburg" incorporated December 7.
- 1846—Grace Lodge No. 157, Independent Order of Odd Fellows, organized March 19.
- 1854—Organization of the Arcadian Institute, a co-educational academy, in the old Court House, April 10. (Remained in existence for 10 years.)
- 1868—Charter granted to Camp 86, Patriotic Order Sons of America, January
- 1869—Erection of a modern six-room school building (Grade School building.)
- 1872—Cigar manufacturing introduced by B. M. K. Kepner, and continued by his son, S. R. Kepner.
- 1873—Old Court House leased to the Orwigsburg Shoe Manufacturing Company for a period of 99 years. This was the first shoe factory in the borough. This company was succeeded by the Rehr Shoe Company.

- 1885—Kepner-Scott Shoe Company established.
- 1886—Friendship Hose Company organized. Incorporated March 7, 1887.
- 1888—Manufacturing of paper boxes first begun. In 1931, the business was purchased by the present owners and incorporated as the Orwigsburg Paper Box Company.
- 1890—Industrial Council No. 437, Order of Independent Americans instituted April 17.
- 1890—First National Bank and Trust Co. organized July 29.
- 1892—Organization of the Orwigsburg Alumni Association.
- 1893—Establishment of the J. S. Zulick Shoe Company.
- 1902—Bethel Commandery No. 319, Ancient and Illustrious Order Knights of Malta instituted February 28.
- 1903—Organization of Lavender Rebekah Lodge No. 49, March 19.
- 1903—Charter granted to the Building and Loan Association, April 22.
- 1907—Werner and Company Shoe Factory organized - (Now known as Krater Shoe Company.)
- 1911—Erection of the original High School Building. Addition was built in 1931-1932.
- 1912—Rohrer Knitting Mill established by William Rohrer. The mill is now owner and operated by Phil, Al and Nate Rosen.
- 1913—Organization of Leininger Knitting Mills.
- 1919—H. H. Fessler Knitting Company organized in January.
- 1919—Lin-Ho-Wa Knitting Company organized in September. The firm name later changed to Sylray Underwear Company.
- 1921—Dedication of St. Francis Orphanage, October 12.
- 1928—Orwigsburg Chapter No. 424, Order of Eastern Star, instituted April 27.
- 1931—Fort Lebanon Chapter No. 123, Daughters of the American Revolution, instituted June 29.
- 1934—Onyx Blouse Company began operation of two factories.
- 1935—Organization of the Orwigsburg Lion's Club, May 24.
- 1940—The Schuylkill County Court confirmed the sale of the Old Court House to the Auburn Brick Company, October 28.
- 1941—Old Court House razed.
- 1945—Organization meeting of Community Memorial, Inc., December 24.

"A War Memorial should be not only a tribute of gratitude, due to the memory of those who distinguished themselves in the glorious cause of liberty, but also conducive to inspire posterity with an emulation of their illustrious actions."

Citizens of Orwigsburg, imbued with the idea of establishing a "living", consequently permanent, expression in commemoration of the achievements and sacrifices of the men and women of Orwigsburg and vicinity who served in the armed forces of all the wars of the Nation, envisioned a memorial of far greater significance in the lives of generations to come; a memorial symbolic of the voiced ideals of the living who served, fought, and suffered; a memorial to foster the indomitable and invincible spirit of those who sacrificed their lives.

As a result, there stands today, on a commanding and imposing site overlooking the beautiful, rolling hills of the community, a practical, beautiful structure, - the concrete expression of gratitude for the courage, loyalty, suffering and sacrifice for the perpetuation of principles and ideals of personal and national freedom, of those whom it commemorates; a memorial destined to influence profoundly the understanding and cooperation, the health and character, particularly of the youth.

The history of its formal inception begins on Monday, November 12, 1945, with a mass meeting of the citizens of Orwigsburg in Greenawalt's Hall. At this meeting, presided over by Harry G. Fegley, president of Town Council, it was enthusiastically determined to build a suitable memorial to Orwigsburg veterans. All men, women, and children of Orwigsburg were to be represented in carrying out the project, and a coordinating committee was subsequently appointed.

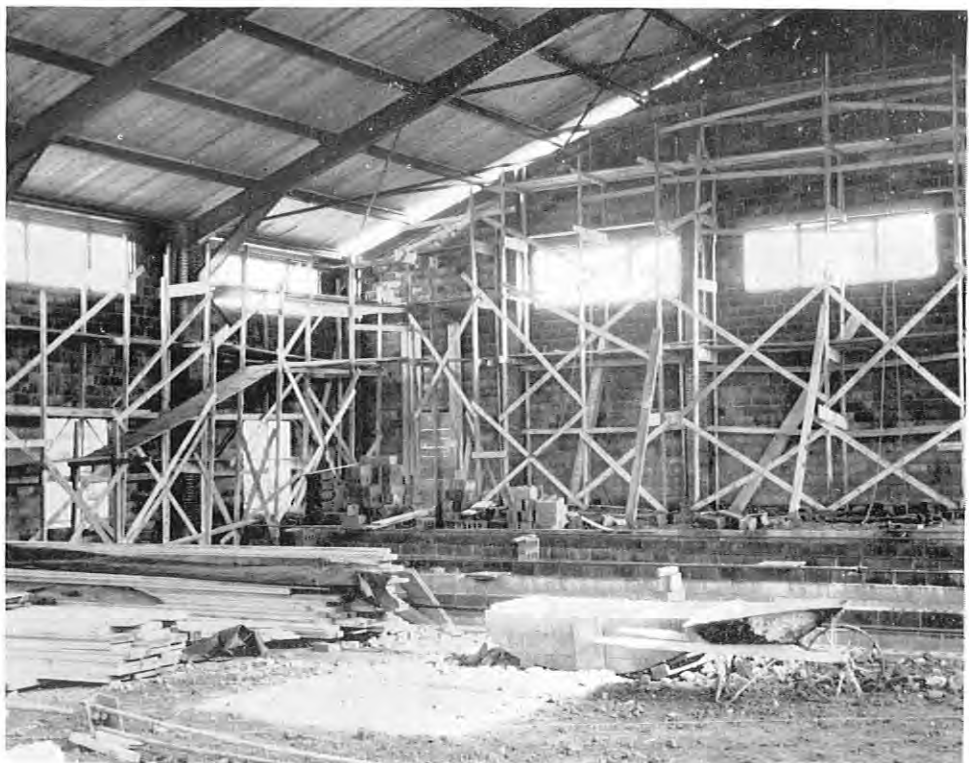

Following the citizens meeting, the committee named, met in the high school auditorium Wednesday, Nov. 21. Every week since that time, the committee has been meeting in the high school to execute the wishes for a suitable memorial. The coordination committee organized as a permanent group selection: Harry G. Fegley, president; Elmer E. Steinbrunn, vice-president; Rev. A. L. Creager, secretary; Harold C. Shoener, treasurer; The Executive Board includes the four elected officers, also Dr. Darkes, John Morrison, Jess Houtz, Carl R. Koch, Edgar Wagner and Guy Waltman.

The Executive Board organized the committee-at-large into separate committees: Campaign, E. E. Steinbrunn, chairman; Site and Building Committee, John W. Morrison; chairman; Publicity, Herbert Wagner, chairman; Program, Mrs. Guy Waltman, chairman.

The sixty-one members of the committee-at-large were placed on one of the committees to execute the enormous amount of work required in the project. Following committee organization and campaigns planned subsequent committee meetings developed the need for incorporation in order to receive funds and transact business. This need was made clear when E. E. Steinbrunn, chairman of the Campaign Committee, reported a collection of \$8000 was deposited

in the local bank in the name of the Co-Ordinating Committee. Following preliminary work Guy Waltman reported that application for the incorporation of "Community Memorial, Inc." had been filed. A dramatic incident of incorporation was presented by the determination of Guy Waltman to complete the organization in 1945. Supported by the local committee members, a meeting was held Christmas eve, 1945, and Community Memorial, Inc. became a chartered organization.

Proposed sites, essay contests, poster contests, citizens meetings, letters written and mailed, house to house solicitations, Wednesday night meetings, extra Executive Board meetings, constant efforts and expenditure of time and money from members of the committee reviews in a small way the tremendous work accomplished by the committee members. Significant, is the fact that all the time and effort by these citizens of Orwigsburg is in addition to their own contribution of money to the project.

No small part of the initial work was assigned to various committees for a house-to-house canvass for specific explanation of the purpose of the project, for enlisting the interest of all people of the community, and for the soliciting of funds and pledges.

The following team captains were in charge of the local campaign: No. 1, Charles L. Sauer No. 2, Alfred Dietrich; No. 3, Harry R. Potter; No. 4, Clarence C. Clauser; No. 5, Ralph Kauffman and Mrs. Ira L. Fridirici; No. 6, Arthur L. Zulick and Clarence B. Brown; No. 7, Mrs. Earl B. Albright, Henry H. Fessler and Franklin R. Schaeffer; No. 8, Mrs. Edgar W. Wagner and Mrs. J. Bartolet Moyer; No. 9, Mrs. Harry L. Lessig and Theo. Schneider; No. 10, Paul Faust, Sr., and John Z. Haeseler; No. 11, Elmer E. Steinbrunn and John Barr; No. 12, Clyde Moyer and Guy F. Shoener; No. 13, Harry G. Fegley and Ralph H. Deibert; No. 14, Walter J. H. Gerhard and Harry Wildermuth; No. 14, Carl R. Koch and Harold C. Shoener.

The resulting response to these solicitations was gratifying to such an extent that the committee members who accepted the responsibility of Community Memorial Incorporated saw the possibility of the realization of their vision, for the funds totaled, April 9, 1946, \$35,000, and it was obvious to them that further deliberation upon all aspects of the original plan would permit alterations contingent upon changed conditions and resources.

A major problem was presented in the choice of a site. Natural features, problems of traffic congestion, convenience, and future development of attractive surroundings were given prolonged deliberation. Through the magnanimous and philanthropic presentation by Mr. Elmer E. Steinbrunn of a plot at the juncture of Washington and Grove Streets, there was created a site at once distinctive and useful, with the possibilities of a recreational center enjoyed by few communities the size of Orwigsburg.

By December, 1946, the total amount of money for the project reached the encouraging sum of \$42,000. With ever receding ideals the newly elected Executive Board, President, Harry G. Fegley; Vice President, E. E. Steinbrunn; Secretary, Linwood Krater; Treasurer, Harold Shoener; Dr. W. F. Darkes, John Morrison, Jess Houtz, Carl R. Koch, Edgar Wagner, and Guy Waltman, set the goal at \$50,000.



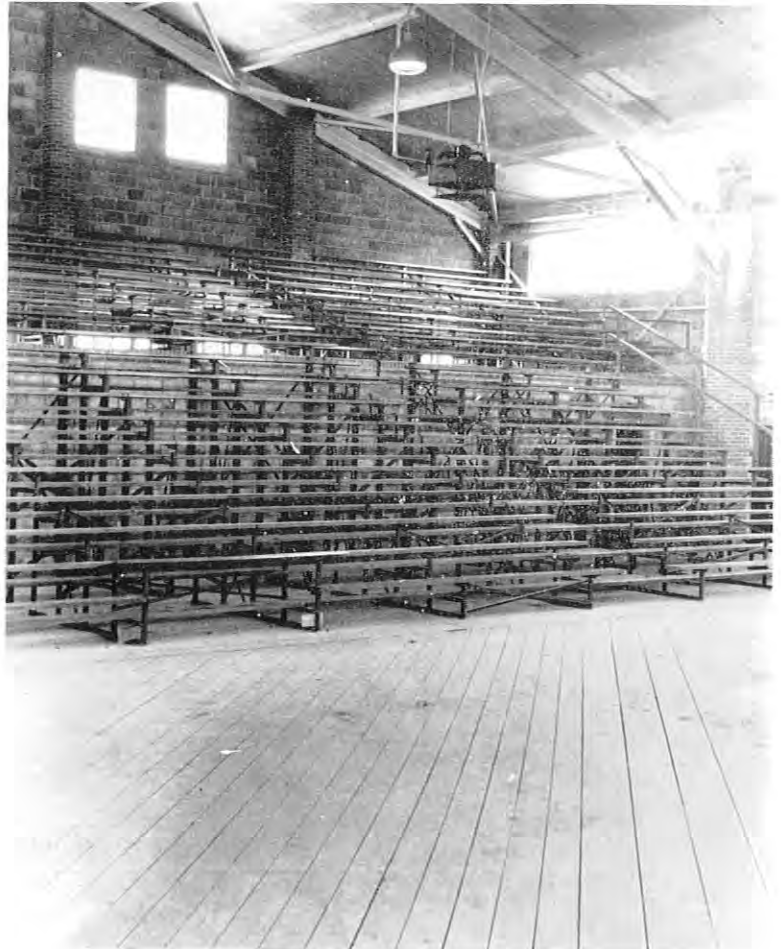

Additional contributions, payment of pledges, auction, community "booster" dinner, and various projects during the years in which the members of the Board never wavered in their objectives, accordingly increased the funds available, so that by May, 1949, the first contract was awarded to the Luria Engineering Corporation of New York for steel which arrived in September, 1949. Bids for various phases of the work were received and rejected and construction proceeded on a material and labor cost basis under the direction of Paul Faust, contractor. All contractors of Orwigsburg were invited to meet with the Board of Directors and agreements were made that work would proceed until no more funds were available. Their cooperation was inestimable in the completion of the enormous task confronting the Directors.

The support and efforts of all organizations and all groups and professions of the community give evidence of the possible accomplishments of unified action. The interest that accrues in the enriched lives of those who avail themselves of the facilities, will be sufficient reward to those who have labored strenuously.

The Executive Board at present consists of the following members: Harry G. Fegley, President; Elmer E. Steinbrunn, Vice-President; Linwood P. Krater, Secretary; Harold C. The Orwigsburg Community Memorial stands today, a tribute, not only to those who fought for home and country, to the citizens and friends who contributed generously, but also to the untiring and unselfish efforts of the men and women who, regardless of attendant discouragements over a period of years, have brought the project to fruition. It will endure in the minds and hearts of those to come, as an inspiration to emulate the loyalty, service, sacrifice, no less in peace than in war. It stands a "Living Memorial."


